



### Home School Reading

#### At school we will be responsible for:

- Writing comments in their home reading booklet and reading comments made by you.

#### At Home you will be responsible for:

- Listening to your child read every day.
- Writing comments on your child's reading in their home school reading booklet.
- Ensuring they bring their reading book and record to school every day.




### Attendance


#### Extended services at Star

#### 6 O'clock club

Looking for affordable childcare? Here at Star, we offer a daily club from 3-6pm in which pupils are supervised by qualified members of staff. Pupils are provided with:

- A daily snack e.g. pasta, sandwiches, beans on toast.
- A wide range of activities e.g. arts and crafts, cooking, sport, games, computing.
- The opportunity to socialise with friends when taking part in activities and games on offer.
- Opportunities to complete homework and reading, independently or supported by staff.

Pupils may attend daily, weekly or just once in a while. Ask at the school office to register your child for 6 O'clock club.



We offer a special deal if your child signs up to 6 O'clock club weekly or monthly. Pupils from Reception to year 6 can join.
