

## PE & SPORTS GRANT REPORT FOR 2018 -2019

Star Primary received £9000 PE & Sports Grant. This report explains how the funding was used.

Star is committed to the highest quality of provision for sports across the school. We receive £9000 per year Sports Premium funding and £2800 is spent on before and after school sports provision hosting a wide variety of sporting activities including Ballet, Multisport, Table Tennis, archery and Basketball. We provide 19 clubs outside of school hours, 60% of which promote physical activity.

Cumberland is a Specialist Sports College and we pay £2,645 each year to enhance our PE and Sports curriculum to offer specialist teaching from KS3 teachers.
