

WEEKLY UPDATE: RETURN TO SCHOOL



Dear Parents/Carers,

We are fast approaching the end of the school year, and what an unusual year it has been. You will know that the arrangements for all children to return to school in September is very complicated and I want to make sure that all pupils and staff can return as safely as possible. I cannot thank you enough for the support you continue to give me and the team here at Star. I have tried to keep the information in this newsletter as simple as possible because I know it is a lot to take in.

- **In September there will be no breakfast club BUT the start of the school day will change to 7:50am.** This will reduce the risk of infection of class bubbles mixing across the school in the breakfast club.
- If your child is attending the **AM** session they will start at **7:50** and finish at **10:50**. If your child is attending the **PM** session they will start at **11:20** and finish at **2:20**. If your child has a confirmed space for a full session they will start at **7:50** and finish at **2:20**.

Please ensure you inform school of any changes to your address, phone number or medical needs for your child at info@star.newham.sch.uk or by calling the school office. **It is vital that we have the correct email address logged on Parent Mail.**





YOUR QUESTIONS ANSWERED

(RETURN TO SCHOOL IN SEPTEMBER)

Do I have to send my child into school in September?

- From September 2020 all children should attend school.

How will school minimize the risk of transmission?

At Star we will ensure we maintain,

- robust hand washing and personal hygiene... 'catch it, bin it, kill it'
- more regular cleaning
- active engagement with NHS Test and Trace
- From September children will be in class bubbles and at play and lunchtime be in year group bubbles. Maintaining distinct groups or 'bubbles' that do not mix makes it quicker and easier in the event of a positive case to identify those who may need to self-isolate, and keep that number as small as possible. This includes, desks facing the front, staggered lunches and breaks and the use of a one way system around school at certain times of the day. There will be no whole school events such as assembly or singing assembly. In the Autumn Term there will be no school trips or whole school events like the Winter Market and Singing in the Community. Parent Information Meetings will all take place virtually.

What time will school start in September?

- To facilitate travel to school during non-peak hours for pupils, parents and staff, governors have agreed to change **the school day to 7.50 to 2.05/10**. Your child will still receive the same amount of teaching time, just one hour earlier.

How will you ensure that my child settles confidently into Nursery?

- All children are unique, some will separate from their parents/carers with ease whereas others will find it difficult. In order to ensure the children transition into Nursery confidently we will be providing some activities outside to facilitate a supported transition time where parents can engage their child in an activity alongside a member of staff who will begin to build a relationship with your child. We will work with parents to ensure your child experiences a positive start to their school life at Star.

What will lunchtime look like for my child who is attending all day?

- Your child will choose a lunch at the beginning of the school day. At 10:30 your child's lunch will be delivered to the nursery classroom where they will enjoy eating with their teachers and

peers. Your child's class teacher will be able to provide any feedback of concerns regarding your child's eating behaviours and offer advice or alternatives to help support them.

Can I drop my child off in the playground?

- To ensure there are no large gatherings and social distancing can be adhered to we will be using all entrances to school, including the large green gates on Star Lane. Staff will be available to help guide you. There will be no waiting in the playground and we encourage you to leave once your child is collected. Only one adult per household should drop off or pick up.
- Please see diagrams above for entry and exit points.

What happens if my child is unwell at school?

- If anyone in the school becomes unwell with a new, continuous cough or a high temperature, or has a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia), they will be sent home and advised to follow '[stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus \(COVID-19\) infection](#)', which sets out that they must self-isolate for at least 7 days and should [arrange to have a test](#) to see if they have coronavirus (COVID-19). Other members of their household (including any siblings) should self-isolate for 14 days from when the symptomatic person first had symptoms.

What if a child has covid19 in my child's bubble?

- If there is a confirmed case of Covid 19 in a class then we will ask that bubble to self isolate for 14 days.

If we have to self isolate or there are local lockdowns - How will my child continue to learn?

- At Star we will be prepared to offer remote learning to all pupils if there is full lockdown or local lockdown. Children will be encouraged to access their learning tasks through google drive. We will also be launching Google classroom in September which will better facilitate learning from home and improve interactions between teacher and pupil.

What will be different about the school day?

- School will look different in September but we are very excited to have every single pupil back. Your child may enter through a different door, perhaps have their classroom on a different floor but any measure we put in place will be there to ensure the safety of your children and our staff at Star.

Does my child have to wear a uniform?

- Yes. Children must wear clean clothes each day.
- We suggest that as soon as your child returns home from school they shower and change out of their clothes, which should then be washed as quickly as possible. This will reduce the risk to others in your household.
- During the warmer weather, **please do not send your child with a coat.**

What about other items?

- Children may bring an individual water bottle with them.
- If it is cold, they can bring a coat or if it is hot, they can bring in a hat.
- Book bags and reading books can be brought in and go home with children.
- Children will need their full PE kit for September including Fit Friday Uniform.

What about PPE?

- You may wish your child to wear PPE whilst travelling but they must not wear it when they come into school.
- This is because a child is unlikely to wear a face mask for the entire day (particularly when running around outside) and therefore will want to take it off. This poses a bigger risk than not wearing one.
- Staff will generally not be wearing PPE which is why the social distance measures are in place in all rooms (including staff areas).
- Staff will only wear PPE if there is a risk of contact with bodily fluids i.e. first aid, or if they are involved with helping younger children use toilet facilities. They will also wear it if they are looking after someone who displays possible COVID symptoms.
- In these cases, the PPE will be disposable gloves & aprons. They may also be wearing a clear visor.

Can my child mix with friends or relatives who may be in another bubble?

- Unfortunately, no. Each bubble needs to stay within itself both in the classroom and outside in the playground.
- Each bubble will be given allocated space and times to be in the playground every day, but they will not be able to play with children from other bubbles who may be in a different area.

What about social distancing in the classroom ?

- The children will be encouraged to sit on the carpet at a distance from their peers.
- We will utilise outside space as much as possible too.

What will the Early Years look like?

- Reception classrooms will be in four groups, allowing for smaller class sizes.
- Every reception space will also have an outdoor space for the use of their bubble.
- We will of course make use of this for as many activities as possible, in addition to break and lunch play.

How will you look after my child's well-being?

- This has been a challenging time for everyone and that includes children.
- Many of our families have experienced illness, change in family circumstances and bereavement.
- We realise that many children may be scared to be outside with others, whilst others will be looking forward to it but find the restrictions they must follow difficult.
- Our Pastoral Team will advise staff within the bubbles on ways to explore this with children and help them adjust to this 'new normal'.

- Staff will also receive additional training in relation to supporting children's mental health and how to support those who have experienced bereavement.
