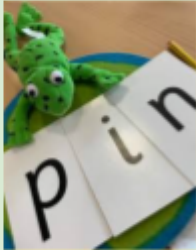

What a fabulous time we had in Year 1 last week!

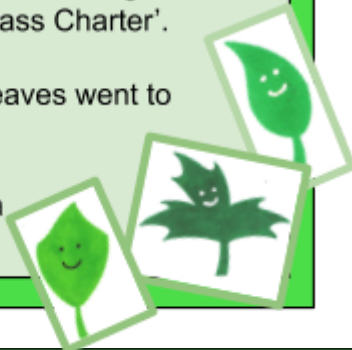
Fred the frog mysteriously went missing and we had to write some amazing sentences to get him to come back.

This week in Year 1 we will delve a little deeper into the word 'respect'. In class the children will be invited to take part in a series of fun debates, where we will practise listening to the ideas and opinions of others.

We are learning to use the Zones of Regulation to help us understand and manage our feelings. For example, if we feel happy, we can say we are in the 'Green Zone'. Being able to communicate how we feel is important because it can help others to support us.



In handwriting we will practise forming the letters b, h, k, m and n. We know that a tripod pencil grip is the best way to do neat work and we have been working hard to keep our letters sitting on the line.

This week we will also start reading new phonics books and begin to investigate patterns within numbers by looking at our 2's, 5's and 10's times tables.
