



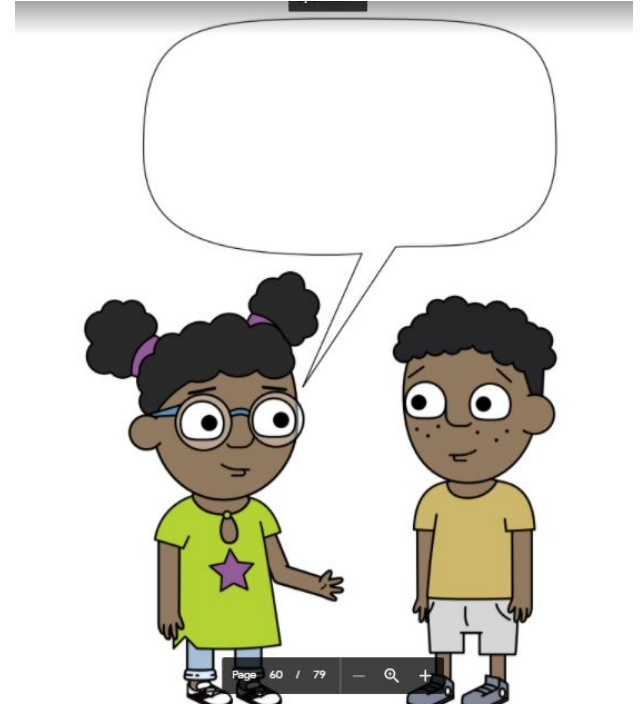

Look at this picture, Jem has Asked Tia for advice about playing Games safely online. **What could she tell him?** Let's discuss our ideas!

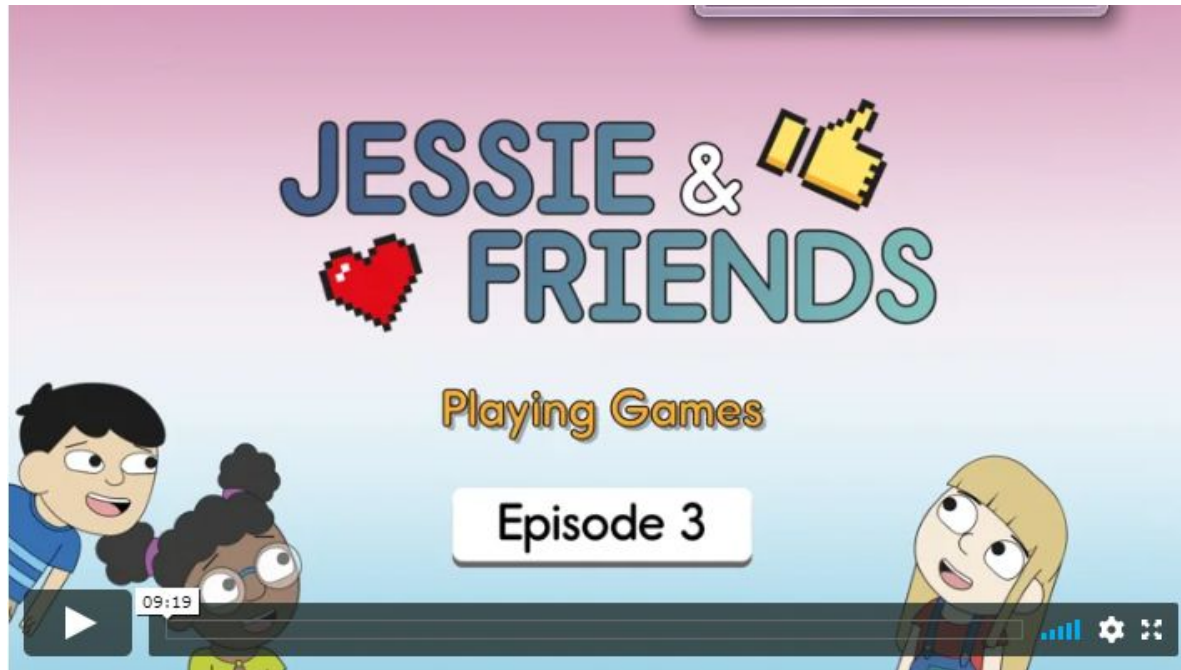

- This adult may have helped you with something before.

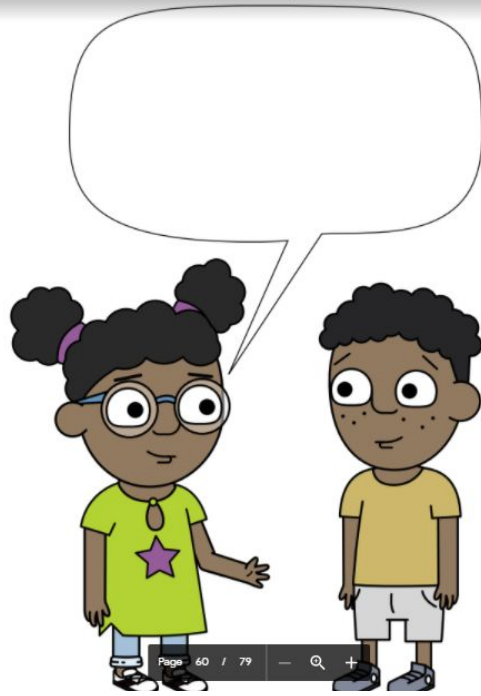
We are going to make a helping hand.
