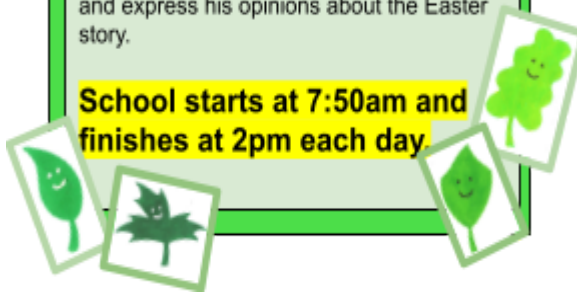
This week's happy leaves go to:

#### Our learning this week

In English, we will engage further with some of the characters in our class book: Noah Barleywater Runs Away. We will be writing diaries and letters from different character's perspectives. Finally, we will be taking on the role of the author, to suggest an alternative ending for this book.

In maths, we will be recapping finding the area of parallelograms and drawing 2D shapes.

As scientists, we will be investigating Darwin's theory of evolution and natural selection with a focus on how animals change over generations.

In RE, we will be analysing how Jesus has been depicted in art and will make comparisons between two different paintings of Jesus.

In Computing, we will be discussing online content that can cause us worry or concern.

In Geography, we will be recognising the human and physical similarities and differences between Canning Town and the Lake District.

In RSHE, we will be talking about our experiences over lockdown and how we feel now we're back at school!
