This week's learning...

Children will continue with workshops by Diverse Voices - where they learn about current social issues in preparation for moving on to secondary school. In addition they will be taking part in a theatre workshop next week Tuesday 29th June. This will be an opportunity for the children to develop their artistic talents and will prepare them for the Year 6 Awards Ceremony.

We will be thinking about lifestyle choices in science and the impact of healthy and unhealthy choices on the circulatory system. We will create posters to raise awareness of the importance of a healthy lifestyle in order to maintain a healthy heart and body.

In Spanish, the children will learn about different types of fruit and revise how to identify Spanish words in singular or plural form. We will have a whole computing day next Friday where the children will be building and programming moving robots using Lego and their chromebooks. Clothing for Awards Ceremony:

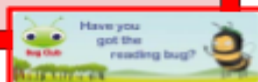
