## Very Important: Please read carefully!

A **Vomiting and Diarrhea Bug** is currently going around in a few of the classes. The school has to enforce that any child displaying these symptoms be kept at home for **48hrs**. This is a Public Health England guidance requirement.

As vomiting is also a symptom of the **Delta Variant of Covid**, we recommend that you carry out a LFT on your child. If this is positive please do a PCR test and report the results to the school.

We are also experiencing a few cases of **chickenpox** within the school. If your child has chickenpox they will need to stay off school until all the scabs dry up (usually 5 days).
