## Do you know what your child is doing online?

This week we have had to deal with a very serious online safety incident affecting a few of our Year 6 pupils. I do need to remind all parents that no primary school aged child should have any whatsapp, instagram, facebook, tik tok or twitter accounts. If they do use these platforms you need to be aware that they are breaking the law. Each of these social media apps have age restrictions that prevent your child from using them. Allowing your child access to this at home means that you are breaking the law as well. These apps can be accessed on any device, not just phones, so please take the time to check which apps your child is using. I cannot stress enough how important it is that you know what your child is doing online. We are here to support you if you have any concerns or need any advice.

#### Article 23 - Children with disabilities

A child with a disability has the right to live a full and decent life with dignity and, as far as possible, independence and play an active part in the community. Governments must do all they can to support disabled children and their families.
