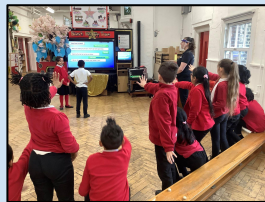

Internet Safety Day

On 8th February we celebrate Safer Internet Day – an annual global event promoting safe and positive use of digital technology for children and young people.

This year, Safer Internet Day will focus on exploring respect and relationships online. This is a great opportunity to discuss with our children how they navigate the online world, while respecting the rights of everyone online. Our activities explore the broad themes of Safer Internet Day with some of them linking to the right to **relax and play (Article 31)**, **protection from harm (Article 19)** and to the importance of respect and dignity.



In 2015, the UN and world leaders agreed to **17 Global Goals for sustainable development**. The aim of the Global Goals is to create a safer, fairer world by 2030 by:

- Ending poverty.
- Reducing inequality.
- Tackling the urgency of climate change.

Your children will be learning more about the Global Goals and finding out how a better world is possible if we all work together to take action and make a difference.

The Goals link to many of our Rights Respecting articles such as Article 12: **Every child has the right to have a say in all matters affecting them, and to have their views taken seriously.**
