## Our new topic is...Express Yourself!



**As readers:** We will develop our reading skills with our new text 'David Hockney - A History of Pictures' as well as using past SATs papers to answer a range of comprehension questions.

**English:** We will be starting to read our new text "Noah Barleywater Runs Away" and make predictions about the themes as well as starting to engage with the main character.

**As mathematicians:** We will be measuring and drawing angles, then begin to look at the properties of 3D shapes.

**As scientists:** Children will investigate how fossils are created and learn how palaeontologists can use fossils to construct knowledge about how living things change over time.
