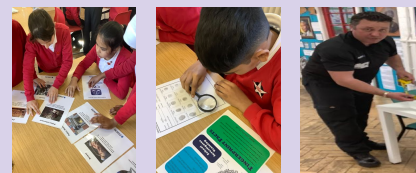
## Year Six Stubbers
