In line with the Government's expectations regarding the announcement of a one-off universal catch-up premium for 2020-2021 academic year, funding received will ensure that all pupils have support and help they need to make up for lost teaching time. Target groups include children identified as disadvantaged and those with the most noticeable gaps in learning according to teacher assessments, alongside pupils who had a period of absence due to isolation.



Our main strategy is the establishment of an after school intervention called Rainbow Club. Targeted children are invited to remain in school for an additional hour 4 days per week. Termly impact evaluations will ensure the correct children attend with groups amended accordingly. Our Community Wellbeing Advocate will support vulnerable families in ensuring they attend the intervention and that parents understand the importance of attendance in relation to their child's learning. During Rainbow Club pupils will receive:

- Support with reading.
- Phonics boosting.
- Access Mathletics and Times Table Rockstars.
- Access Bug Club.
- Complete any homework tasks set by their class teacher.
- Teaching/revision of missed learning.

The funding will be used for the following:

- Purchasing of year group specific workbooks. (CGP)
- A healthy snack.
- Overhead costs for the school.
- Staffing costs.
- Purchasing technology to support learning. Eg. chrome books

Another strategy that we will be implementing through the catch up funding to rapidly enhance children's access to educational visits. We have seen the impact of these lost opportunities on children's awareness of the wider world. Funding will also ensure no parents will be charged for enrichment activities such as educational visits.
