Reception routine (morning)

7:50 - Children enter through the Reception foyer and walk to their classroom to hang their coats and get settled for registration.

8:15 - RWI - The children will begin their phonics learning within their own classrooms to begin with. They will start by learning their set 1 sounds.

8:45-10 - Learning through play: The children will access free flow play where they will choose which area they would like to play including indoors and outdoors.





Reception routine (afternoon)

10:30-11:30 - Lunchtime - Your child will eat their lunch in their classroom with their class teacher and other familiar adults.

11:30-12 - Mathematics. The children will participate in a whole class carpet session.

12-1:30 - Learning through play

1:30-2 - Home time routine - Star of the day, reading certificates, singing and stories.





Maths! No Problem

At Star, we use the Maths - No Problem! scheme of work. A typical lesson will firstly introduce a concept through exploration of concrete materials/objects before progressing through to exploring the concept through picture form. At this stage known as the "seeing stage" - the children make strong connections between the concrete materials/objects and the pictures and diagrams which can represent the materials/objects they have handled in a problem.

Alongside MNP, the Mastering Number programme will help Reception children transition into KS1, being more fluent and confident in mathematical thinking and reasoning. Snappy animation and loveable characters combined with engaging storylines, gently introduce concepts of number to support early mathematical understanding.









The role of the adults

The adults in the nursery facilitate your child's learning by:

- Encouraging
- Supporting
- Explaining
- Suggesting
- Modelling
- Narrating
- Questioning
- Challenging



How you can help your child at home?

- Please ensure your child is developing their fine and gross motor skills at home by
 participating in activities such as; hanging up washing using pegs, using chalk outside to
 make marks on the ground, taking trips to the park and using the equipment.
- Enjoy lots of different experiences with your child i.e. going to the park, farm visits etc. Speak about what you see and introduce new vocabulary as appropriate.
- Encourage your child to continue with their writing journey over the Summer by encouraging them to write letters to relatives, keep a diary about all the Summer activities they experience.
- Read to your child EVERY DAY and encourage your child to read to you.
- You will be invited to a Reading workshop once the children have settled into learning their sounds. Keep your eyes peeled for these dates!

Transition

- Visits to Reception during the Summer term. This is a chance for your child to explore the Reception setting and get to know their teachers.
- Transition booklet: Please share this booklet with your child to help familiarise them with the Reception environment. Look at the photos and encourage your child to speak about what they are excited about exploring in September.
- Staggered/soft start to ensure children settle securely and are happy.
 Individualised settling in plans can be arranged for any child who needs support.

When will my child start School?

- Your child's start date will be given on your last transition session on the 8th July.
- We will have 3 start dates so your child has a chance to settle gradually in smaller class sizes.
- Your child will complete a full day from their first day. If your child is upset and needs support with settling individualised settling in plans can be discussed.
