Our new topic is...Human Rights.



Reading: We will be learning more about the suffragettes and the impact they had on society.

English: We will be delving deeper into the suffragettes and use a range of sources to help us to learn more about women's rights. We will then be writing a letter to Emmeline Pankhurst to thank her for all her efforts!

Maths: Concluding our learning of rounding, we will move onto using mixed operations and use the order of the operations to solve equations. We will then focus on multiplying 3-digit and 4-digit numbers by 2-digit numbers.

Science: Using our knowledge of how light travels in straight lines, we will periscopes to investigate how light can travel in straight lines explain that objects are seen because they give out or reflect light into the eye.

History: We will be studying the life of Frederick Douglass and creating a timeline of the significant events in his life.

RE: We will be identifying how similarities and differences between different religions can make a difference to people's lives and help to build community.

Computing: We will find out why taking and sharing inappropriate images of someone even when they have consented can have an impact for the sharer and others and also find out who can help us if we find ourselves in this situation.
