This week's learning:



Reading: We will be looking at various information texts within the book, 'Suffragette: The Battle for Equality' to build on our knowledge of the women's suffrage movement.

English: We will be recalling the features of a narrative and using all our knowledge of the Suffragettes to start to create our own exciting narratives based on Emmeline Pankhurst.

Maths: We will be working on the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division) and will solve expressions involving brackets and multiply 3-digit and 4-digit numbers by 2-digit numbers.

Science: Using our knowledge of how light travels in straight lines, we will find out why shadows have the same shape as the objects that cast them.

RE: We will explore the importance of religious buildings and their significance in the community.

Computing: We will be finding out the importance of internet addresses.

RSHE: This week, we will have our first lesson on sexual harassment where we will be identifying different forms of sexual harassment and how to report it.

Art: We will find how to use different techniques, colours, tones and effects in an appropriate way to represent things that we see.
