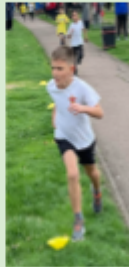

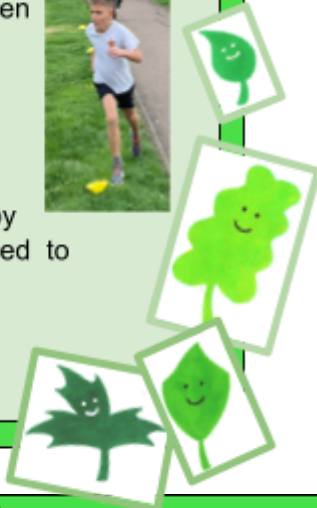
STAR moments

Over to you...Home learning

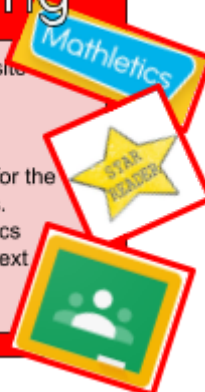
We have a spelling resource for the children to use at home. The website www.oxfordowl.co.uk and Year 4 log on for all children is as follows:
