Shared Reading: We will continue to review our SATs reading paper and focus on the key strategies that are needed to answer 1, 2 and 3 mark questions.

English: We will be learning about the Battle of Issus and begin to plan our newspaper article on this epic battle by writing the headline, orientation and first two paragraphs of the main body of the article.

Maths: We will begin the week by learning about square and prime numbers, multiples and factors. We will then move on to fractions where we will identify fractions of shapes, simplify and convert improper and mixed fractions.

Science: We will be investigating how the brightness of a bulb is related to the voltage of the cell.
