







- FACT Attendance is the key to success for our pupils.
- We expect children to come to school every day.
- Your child only needs to be at home if very unwell. You must call the school if your child is unwell + the school will advise.

- Multiplication check As you may already be aware, all Year 4 pupils across the country sit standardised tests known as the Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) in the summer term. Preparations are well under way in the year group to cover the content the children will need to know. In addition, we will also been supporting the children to become more familiar and confident with what the assessment looks like and the types of questions they can expect to face as the term continues.
