Dear Parents and Carers,





We are starting a new theme this term: The Earth our Home! This will be a really exciting opportunity to learn all about the world around us with a focus on mini crawlers.








As writers, we will be continuing our phonics journey using our Read Write Inc books. Children will be learning new sounds, reading and writing everyday.

Earth Our Home

We have lots of exciting lessons planned:

<u>English:</u> We will be delving deeper into deforestation. We will be embedding all our learning to write a persuasive letter about deforestation

<u>Maths:</u> In Maths, we will be exploring measurement. We will start of by measuring using mm and cm and exploring the relationship between the two units of measurement.

Science: In Science we will be exploring plants. "How do plants produce food for us?" is our key question. We will be looking at the different parts of a plant and their functions

<u>Geography</u>: Where does our food come from? We will be investigating the journey of the different foods we eat.

<u>RE:</u> In our first lesson we explore the Jewish celebration of Rosh Hashanah and compare it to New Years Celebrations.

RSHE: We will be teaching the children about their Support. Who are in their support system and why support isimportant.

<u>Art Year 3</u>- In Art we will be exploring what we know about symmetry and how we can use nature to create symmetrical patterns.

Don't forget!

Children will be given weekly spellings to practise for 5 minutes each night. They will be tested on Fridays. We politely ask children to practice the strategies and extend themselves by using the words in a sentence so that they understand the meaning. There will also be a big focus on Reading. So, please do ensure that you read with your child daily and that you record their progress in the Reading record provided. Please continue to encourage your child to complete their tasks on our online learning platforms including Mathletics, Bug Club and Times Table Rockstars. P.E is on Wednesday - please wear your PE kit to school. Fit Friday is every Friday.

Home learning

Please remember to read every day with your child particularly over half term, this should be kept record of in their Reading Record Books. Children will be sent home with books and will be asked to keep them in their book bags which they can now bring to school daily. Children will also be given weekly spellings beginning next week.

By the end of all Year 3 children need to know their 2,4,5,8 and 10 times tables fluently. So, please log in to Mathletics and TTRS to help you secure a Bronze Badge before the end of this academic year!

Welcome back to a new term. The children appeared excited to be back and are ready to engage in some new learning.

We have begun a new topic called Earth Our Home and already this has been met with great enthusiasm within the classes. We have been talking about adopting an animal and the children have been asked to think of an animal from the rainforest they would like each class to adopt. Ask your child what they think, maybe do some research as a family.







In English, we will evaluate advertisements for their impact, appeal and honesty, focusing in particular on how information about products is presented: exaggerated claims, tactics for grabbing attention, linguistic devices such as puns, jingles, alliteration, invented words. This will lead us into creating a persuasive leaflet over the coming weeks about saving the rainforests. In our shared Reading sessions, we are reading a lovely book called The Great Kapok Tree. We are using this book to read together and discover the wonders of the rainforest. The children also need their reading books and reading records every day for these lessons so please remind your child to bring thiers into school.

In Maths this week, the children are learning how to multiply three numbers. As scientists, the children will be investigating plants and animals and their different habitats. This week we will look at explaining the different feeding roles of animals in a habitat.

In R.E. we are learning about the Hindu faith and in particular what Hindus believe about Gods.

In Geography, we will be taking a closer look at the Amazon rainforest. We will use Digimaps to discover where it is in the world and looking at its physical features

We will continue our weekly Spanish lessons with Mr Ramonet. Your child has a Languagenut login inside their reading record to work on at home. Please encourage your child to log on.

In PE, the children will begin working on their gymnastic and fitness skills. Finally in music, the children will be learning about Gamelan music from Indonesia and looking at notation and rhythm. As you can see, we have a very busy week ahead!

Please ensure your child is at the school gate by 7:45am!

At Star, we have Brighter Starts breakfast and singing in class from 7:50 - 8.10 every morning to support your child with starting the day with as much energy as possible. However we have started to notice in Year 4 children entering school much later than this. Please ensure your child comes to school on time.

Our topic this term is the Earth Our Home

Next week ...

In Shared Reading, we will be supplementing our English research by reading non-fiction texts relating to the effects of climate change.

In English, we will be researching forest fires and flooding for our climate change information leaflets.

In Grammar, we will be identifying and using coordinating conjunctions.

In Maths, we will begin to read line graphs and learn how to interpret and analyse the data.

In Geography, we will be continuing our focus on North America, comparing physical and geographical features of California. We will also be continuing our interesting work on the Zero Carbons Schools project.

In RE, we will be reading the ancient story of Jonah and the Whale and relating it to the Jewish festival of Yom Kippur.

In Science, we will be continuing our work on life cycles – this time exploring the difference between a butterfly's and a stick insect's life cycle.

Please ensure your child is in class by 8:00am!

Our wonderful Brighter Starts sessions in the morning are a wonderful way to kick-start our day and the children get so much out of it. Please make sure they are here to join in!

In Geography, we will be exploring what happens when tectonic plates move.

In Art, we will be focusing on the Artist Barbara Kruger and exploring how she creates her collages.

In RE we will be exploring what Hindus believe about reincarnation.
