### Keep in touch!

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#### English:

As writers, we will be continuing our phonics journey using our Read Write Inc books. Children will be learning new sounds, reading and writing everyday.



**Mathletics** 

As mathematicians, we will be completing some maths revision. We will review and practice our mathematical methods and understanding.

#### R.E.

As theologians, we will be learning about the Sikh story of Guru Nanak. We will discuss what we think the story means and consider what Sikhs believe as a result.

#### Art:

As artists, we will be creating a printed figure of an endangered animal in the style of Henri Matisse. To do this we will dip different shaped sponges into paint and apply them to paper.

#### Science:

As scientist, we will be discussing how the effects of climate change are making some animals endangered. With this in mind, we will be creating a poster about what we can do try to prevent this.

#### Computing

As technicians, we will be using digital software (Sketches School) to create a persuasive poster to help stop climate change.

## **Earth Our Home**

We have lots of exciting lessons planned:

<u>English:</u> We will be publishing our persuasive letters on deforestation. After that we will be exploring leaflets and starting to structure debates

Maths: In Maths we will be exploring capacity.

<u>Science:</u> In Science we will be exploring where our food comes from-We will be looking at whether a particular food type comes from the root, stem, leaves or a seed of a plant.

<u>Geography:</u> Where does our Food come From? We will be locating countries that the Uk imports food from and using a key to represent imported fruits / vegetables.

<u>RE:</u> How do Jews celebrate their beliefs at home and in the synagogue? We learned about the harvest festival Sukkot and the special symbols; linked to it.

Art Year 3 - Collage and prints inspired by nature was our focus.

# Don't forget!

Children will be given weekly spellings to practise for 5 minutes each night. They will be tested on Fridays. We politely ask children to practice the strategies and extend themselves by using the words in a sentence so that they understand the meaning. There will also be a big focus on Reading. So, please do ensure that you read with your child daily and that you record their progress in the Reading record provided. Please continue to encourage your child to complete their tasks on our online learning platforms including Mathletics, Bug Club and Times Table Rockstars. P.E is on Wednesday - please wear your PE kit to school. Fit Friday is every Friday.

### Home learning

Please remember to read every day with your child particularly over half term, this should be kept record of in their Reading Record Books. Children will be sent home with books and will be asked to keep them in their book bags which they can now bring to school daily. Children will also be given weekly spellings beginning next week.

By the end of all Year 3 children need to know their 2,4,5,8 and 10 times tables fluently. So, please log in to Mathletics and TTRS to help you secure a Bronze Badge before the end of this academic year!

## This Week's Learning

In English this week we will learning more on persuasive techniques and the children will learn how to participate in a debate and how to persuade others to see their point of view. The next couple of weeks may get a little heated! In maths we will continue looking at division and multiplication and the children will complete a mental maths and arithmetic tests.

During our foundation lessons in the afternoon, we will continue looking at the Hindu religion in our R.E. lessons and learn how Hindus worship at home. As scientists, children will be describing and explaining how animals have special adaptations for survival. In geography the children will continue their work on the Amazon and looking deeper into deforestation. We will also learn about how changes in the Amazon environment have affected the people who live there. In art, we have been learning about Pop Art and this week the children will look at experimenting with creating mood, feeling and movement by choosing the right materials and techniques. Shared reading will see us complete our work on the Kapok Tree, all children's work in shared reading should be on their pupil drive as it is all completed on Google Classroom - take a look. We have some amazing readers in Year 4 with many edging closer to becoming members of the reading tree. Keep reading at home it really helps.

Carbon Schools/Computing: We will be continuing our project, looking at how food and purchasing contributes to our carbon footprint. We will add this to our Google Site.

**RE:** We will be exploring the concept of accepting things we find difficult by looking at an ancient Buddhist story.

**Geography:** We will be exploring how humans have affected the environment in North America – in particular, California.

**Science:** We will be comparing and contrasting the life cycles of two different mammals.

**Spanish:** In Spanish, we will continue learning new vocabulary relating to the weather.
