Head Teacher's Message

Dear Parents and Carers,

I am so very proud of the wonderful group of children from Star who represented Newham in the London Youth Games finals. They did a fantastic job getting to be the Newham winners and representing the borough in the games. You can read more about their competition later in the newsletter.

We are all very excited about Book Week happening next week. Of course the highlight of the week will be dressing up day next Thursday! I cannot wait to see all the creative costume ideas based on favourite book characters.

We are also looking forward to our next parents evening consultations on Wednesday 20th March. Please make a note of this date and make sure that you book an appointment to discuss your child's learning and progress with their teachers.

I am asking parents to carefully read the section in this newsletter relating to Whatsapp and online safety. I was really disappointed to hear that some of our children at Star are using whatsapp to be incredibly inappropriate and nasty online. Despite everything that we teach them in school, the best way to ensure online safety is to carefully monitor what they have access too. Whatsapp is not appropriate for any child of primary age. They are not mature enough to have constant and unsupervised access to their friends at all times. They cannot cope with this level of information and feel under pressure to be popular by saying things that they would not normally say in the real world. I have often shared with you that I understand from a parents point of view how hard it is to limit what your child has access to, but primary aged children must be monitored at all times while they are online. We will be more than happy to help you to put parental controls on your child's devices. Please reach out to Mrs Clarke or a member of the Admin and Pastoral Teams if you need help weaning your child off their devices. Parents must make every effort to find out more about the apps that their children are using and how to protect them online.

On a brighter note, we have noticed that the mornings are just a little bit lighter and now is a good time to start encouraging healthy habits such as walking, cycling or scooting to school.

Online Safety - Whats App

WhatsApp is one of the most popular instant messaging apps, used by over 2 billion people in 180 countries. It allows you to send and receive messages, as well as make voice and video calls. You can connect with people individually or join group chats where lots of people can contribute.



The app is rated 16+. This means your child SHOULD NOT have access to this app.

What are the risks of using WhatsApp?

Unwanted Contact from Strangers: To contact somebody on WhatsApp, all you need is their phone number. This means that your child could be at risk of receiving unwanted messages or calls from others.

Pressure to respond: Features that allow other users to see when your child is online, if they have read a message or when they were last active on the app could make your child feel pressured to respond even when they don't want to.

Location Sharing: The live location feature means that your child could reveal their current location to others. This feature can be used in groups as well as individual chats so your child could reveal this information to people that they don't know if they are in the same group.

Inappropriate Content: WhatsApp messages are end-to-end encrypted which means that the content cannot be monitored. This means that your child could see or hear harmful or upsetting content.

Cyberbullying: WhatsApp groups can be controlled by an 'admin', who can change settings, such as the name of the group, who is allowed to send messages, as well as being able to invite and remove people from the chat. This could lead to children feeling left out or being deliberately excluded or removed from groups.

Oversharing: Privacy features, such as disappearing and 'view once' messages, might mean that your child feels safe to reveal private information or images. However, there is always a risk that an unintended person might see what they have sent, for example if they are with the recipient.

On Tuesday 27th February our Star Boccia Team represented the whole of Newham in the prestigious London Youth Games.

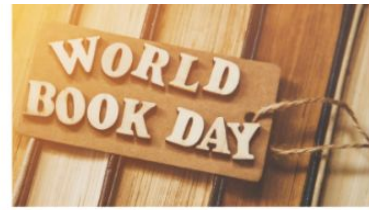

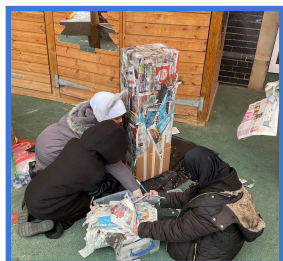


Back by popular demand, it's the much loved 'Masked Reader'. Can the children identify the teacher behind the mask?

We sent a request out to our school community to collect any blue, green and white plastic lids and used tinfoil. Well, you didn't disappoint. The response was amazing, so thank you so much.



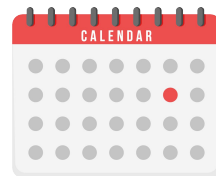
With all the resources necessary, the Art Leaders worked really hard to first paper mache, paint, design and then attach the foil and plastic lids.

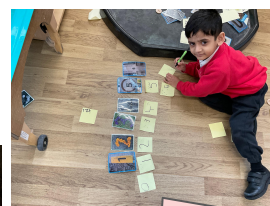

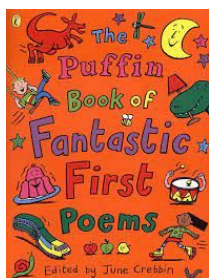
THIS WEEK'S LEARNING

Next week we will be beginning to measure length and height in maths as well as begin to listen to the fantastic poems.

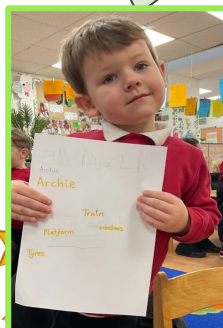

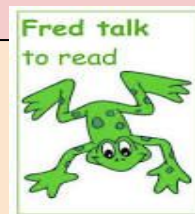

Spring 2: Express Yourself



English:

As writers, we will be continuing our phonics journey using our Read Write Inc books. Children will be learning new sounds, reading and writing everyday.

Maths:

As mathematicians, we will be working on word problem solving using a range of methods to solve them. Read Mathletics as each child has some activities assigned.

Mathletics

RE:

Next week, we will be learning about the how christians show belonging to their faith by looking at similarities and differences between a Christening and a Baptism Ceremony.

Geography:

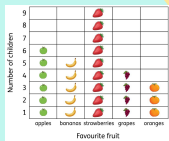

Express Yourself!

We have lots of exciting lessons planned for next week:

In English We will be moving on to our final week of story writing. We will be polishing our story drafts and having a go at writing our final story edit using figurative language and paragraphs.

In Maths we will be continuing our investigation into money. We will be looking at adding and subtracting it using the column method.

In Science: We will be dissecting plants and looking at how pollination is caused.

In R.S.H.E. This term we have been looking at 'Positive Relationships (part 2)' in RSHE. We will be learning about how to stay safe online and in real life.

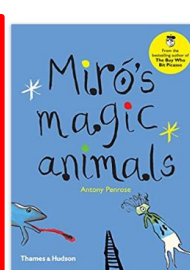
Don't forget!

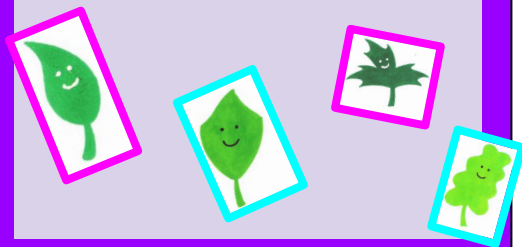

Chewing gum or sweets are not permitted in school. Please remind your child of this at home.

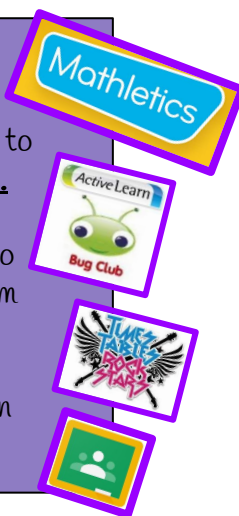

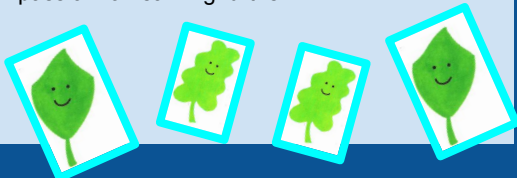
