Online Safety - Screen Time

This week we think about the amount of screentime we are all having: adults and children alike. Research suggests that by the age of 8, children are having almost 3 hours of screen time outside of school and this rises to over 4 hours by the time they reach the age of 12. This increases to even more hours at the weekend!

What are the risks of too much screen time?

- Negative impacts on children's wellbeing. Research found that
 9-10-year-old girls feel more negative impacts from being online than other children. This includes feelings of FOMO and impacts on body image.
- **Pressure to stay online** from friends, or worries about missing out on what others do can make it hard for children to 'switch off'. This might result in late nights and a negative feeling towards their devices.
- As children become more active online there is an increased risk of encountering online safety issues such as inappropriate content, cyberbullying and grooming.
- Passive screen time such as scrolling social media or watching TV could have a **negative affect on their physical and developmental wellbeing**.
 This might include trouble sleeping or focusing, mood swings, or weight gain and body pains due to inactivity.



OVER TO YOU


- Play "I spy something beginning with..." and "I spy something that rhymes with..." (sounds introduced so far: m, a, s and t)



In maths this week, we will be learning about 3D shapes! This is a completely new concept to children in Reception


and we know they're going to be great! Our aim is to not only recognise 3D shapes but also to build with 3D shapes!



We have lots of exciting lessons planned:

English: In English we will be completing Reading, Spelling and Grammar tests to assess our ability to understand Fiction and Non-fiction texts. We will be drawing inferences and explaining words in context.

Maths: In Maths, we will be begin looking at Time. We will be exploring am and pm. We will then be reading 5 minute intervals on an analogue clock.

Science: In Science we will be reflecting on our learning and adding any new learning to our thinking frames.

Geography: We will become Weather Forecasters. We will be creating weather reports for the UK and Spain and comparing the weather conditions in each country

RE: In RE we will be enjoying Holi Dance Workshops. A special visitor will be engaging us in different activities to celebrate this Hindu festival.


Art In Art we will be exploring what we know about symmetry and how we can use nature to create symmetrical patterns.

Children will be given weekly spellings to practise for 5 minutes each night. They will be tested on Fridays. We politely ask children to practice the strategies and extend themselves by using the words in a sentence so that they understand the meaning. There will also be a big focus on Reading. So, please do ensure that you read with your child daily and that you record their progress in the Reading record provided. Please continue to encourage your child to complete their tasks on our online learning platforms including Mathletics, Bug Club and Times Table Rockstars. P.E is on Wednesday - please wear your PE kit to school. Fit Friday is every Friday.

Please remember to read every day with your child particularly over half term, this should be kept record of in their Reading Record Books. Children will be sent home with books and will be asked to keep them in their book bags which they can now bring to school daily. Children will also be given weekly spellings beginning next week.

By the end of all Year 3 children need to know their 2,4,5,8 and 10 times tables fluently. So, please log in to Mathletics and TTRS to help you secure a Bronze Badge before the end of this a year!

Year 4 visited Cliff Walk Evangelical Church this week to take part in an Easter Experience.

The children took part in a variety of activities including drama, singing, painting and gardening. The leaders were very impressed with the children's knowledge of the Easter story as well as their behaviour during the visit, they were a credit to Star!



This Week's Learning

This week sees us attending another rehearsal for Festival of Voices, hosted by Ranelagh Primary School. We will be attending during the morning and have our lunch as usual when we return. As writers, the children will become poets as we start our second cycle of our English unit of work on poetry.

As Mathematicians this week, we will begin work on Maths No Problem book 4B. The children will begin looking at decimals. As scientists, the children will use their knowledge of electricity to make a buzzer game, look out for the videos on Google Drive. As geographers, we will plan and carry out a geographical investigation on rainfall in Kenya, plan the steps and strategies for our investigation and compare the amount of rainfall between Nairobi and London. The children will be using secondary data in order to complete this task.

As artists, we will continue our work inspired by Frida Kahlo, the children will experiment with creating mood, feeling and areas of interest by choosing the right materials and techniques learnt this term. They will then complete the task by explaining how they would improve their work using technical terms and give reasons for this. We are asking all children continue practising their times tables, remember the practise tests are on Google Classroom. The teachers are seeing improvements every day! In Year 4 the staff will be creating an information video about where you can find help with helping your child learn their times tables. Look out for it soon.
