<u>Recycle</u> – Use recyclable plastic when you need to . Most of the time , plastic ends up in the sea and many fishes die to it . Whereas recyclable plastic can be used over and over again.

Have you heard of **cyberbullying**? Cyberbullying is the use of technology to harass, threaten, embarrass, or target another person. Online threats and mean, aggressive, or rude texts, tweets, posts, or messages all count. So does posting personal information, pictures, or videos designed to hurt or embarrass someone else.

Archie and Ruby's Top Tips for How to Deal with Cyberbullying

- **Don't Reply**-to messages that harass or annoy you This is exactly what the sender wants. If you respond with an even nastier message it makes them think that they really got to you, and that's just what they want. They might even complain about you!
- **Keep the message** -You don't have to read it, but keep the evidence. Website owners, mobile phone companies and the police will all look for evidence before they will be able to take any action to help you.
- **Block the sender-**Don't put up with someone harassing you. If you are getting messages that upset you, block the person by clicking the block button and blocking the caller's number.
- **Tell someone you trust** -Talk to your parents, friends, and a teacher you trust or a guidance counsellor. Childline also help support young people.
- **Report problems-**to the people who can do something about it. Responsible websites, social media apps, messaging apps and mobile phone operators provide ways for their users to report things such as bullying content or rude material.

Global Treasures

Our Topic for this half term is Global Treasures. Join us as we explore the exciting lessons planned: <u>English</u>: We will be looking at the fascinating play MACBETH by Shakespeare. Children will be exploring how to write their own play scripts. They will be editing and polishing their play scripts.

<u>Maths:</u> In Maths, we will be continuing to explore Time. We will focus on working out time differences in different countries. This will include working out hours ahead or behind using subtraction or addition on the number line.

<u>Science</u>: In Science we will be learning about fossils. Children will begin to Identify fossils and the process of how they are formed.

<u>History :</u> This week children will explore artefacts from the different Ages and make deductions about what they might have been used for . They will also state what they know for certain about the artefacts

<u>RE:</u> In our RE we will be exploring Sik Symbols and their meanings.

<u>DT</u> : In DT, we will be starting to explore the purpose of boats. We will look at materials and the structure of boats.

Home learning

Please remember to read every day with your child particularly over half term, this should be kept record of in their Reading Record Books. Children will be sent home with books and will be asked to keep them in their book bags which they can now bring to school daily. Children will also be given weekly spellings beginning next week.

By the end of all Year 3 children need to know their 2 ,4, 5 ,8 and 10 times tables fluently. So, please log in to Mathletics and TTRS to help you secure a Bronze Badge before the end of this academic year!

Week's Learnind

This week see our final week of Cycle 1 in English where the children will begin to plan their own play script, they will be describing their characters and setting all ready to add to their scene. They will be using their skills from the theatre group workshop to help them create their work. In our Maths No Problem lessons the children continue their work on money, looking at solving word problems. We are also continuing with out times Tables practise and we ask you do these at home with your child and if you can, test them with a couple of quick questions each day. During our foundation lessons we will working on Design and Technology where the children will design a Roman chariot. As Historians we continue our work on the Romans and we will look at and the Roman era and put the new time period into a wider historical context using a timeline. As Theologians in RE we will continue to learn about marriage and weddings within different religions. In science this week we continue our work on sound and the children will be learning to explain the difference between pitch and sound. Finally, we have a Festival of Voices rehearsal here at Star on Tuesday afternoon so the children may be dismissed around 5 minutes later than usual.

Our **Shared Reading** this half term will be all about the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings, to complement our History lessons. We will be looking at a range of fiction and non-fiction texts, using our comprehension skills: retrieval, inference, prediction – as well as exploring language and vocabulary choices

In **English**, we are completing our playscripts, looking at all of the features to make these including powerful vocabulary and detailed stage directions.

In **History**, we will be continuing our exploration of Anglo-Saxon artefacts, specifically looking at the discovery at Sutton Hoo.

In **Maths**, we will be carrying on our work on Decimals, comparing decimal and fraction equivalents upto 3 decimal places.

In **R.E.** we will be investigating Muslim beliefs about God and link different viewpoints from Muslims and Christians about what God is like.

In **Science**, we will be drawing conclusions from last week's investigation where we mixed different materials to find out if the solutions were an example of a reversible change

In **DFT,** we will begin to generate and develop our ideas for our catapults through annotated sketches.

Spellings will continue to be uploaded to the Google Classroom on a Monday.

Spelling tests will take place on a Friday.

Please encourage your child to practise these throughout the week.
