Online Safety - <u>Fake News</u>

This week, our online safety message mirrors that of Victoria, our Deputy Head Girl.

Digital platforms have made it easier for anyone to share information online, and it can be difficult to determine whether something is real or false. False information that is spread online is known as misinformation or disinformation. These are most commonly referred to as 'fake news' or 'hoaxes'.

Misinformation is where false information is shared accident without the intent to cause harm. For example, sharing inaccurate photos, quotes or dates online because you believe them to be true.

Disinformation is false information shared deliberately to mislead and cause harm. For example, fabricated news stories. A hoax is an example of disinformation. It is where someone deliberately shares false information to trick someone believing something that isn't true. Hoaxes can come in different forms, for example it could be a fake news story or a message.

Hoaxes can be spread quickly as it's not always easy to spot when something contains false information. People might read something they believe to be true and then go on to share it with others. This can happen online. It can also happen offline by talking about the hoax and fuelling the rumours.

Please support us in reminding your child that not everything they see / hear / share online is reliable and if they are unsure, they should discuss the content in more detail with a trusted adult.

Nursery will continue exploring the woodwork area,




becoming more confident in using tools like a hammer, screwdriver and japanese saw, whilst following the health and safety rules we have



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Global Treasures

English:

As writers, we will be continuing our phonics journey using our Read Write Inc books. Children will be learning new sounds. reading and writing everyday. We encourage children to log in Regularly at the Bug Club. All children have books assigned to them.

Maths:

Mathletics As mathematicians, we will be working with numbers up to 100. Sequencing them from the smallest to the greatest and vice versa, partitioning them into tens and ones and comparing them by looking at their tens and ones. Remember to log in at Mathletics as each child has some activities assigned.

RE;

Next week, we will be learning about show their faith by talking about the 5 pillars that reflect their acts of faith that all Muslims have to obey.



History:

Pupils will be learning how toys have changed overtime with the development of the digital technology and introduction of computers.

Children will be creating a slider toy to demonstrate how it works.

Science:

As scientist, we will be continuo searching information about parts of the plant and we will be focussing on focussing on trees. We also will be doing some planting.

Computing:

This week we will be searching about how toys have been advertised in order to collect information in preparation for us to create our own advertisement.

The teachers will continuously be providing online opportunities for reading, phonics and maths. We are checking who is logging on every week!

Pupils must:

- Log on and use **BUG CLUB** daily (please also read and share any extra books you have at home)
- Log on and use **MATHLETICS** daily
- Play and complete any additional material/videos sent you via the google classroom. Phonics session videos will be sent regularly.
- Extra RWI phonics https://home.oxfordowl.co.uk/reading/reading-schemes-oxford-levels/ read-write-inc-phonics-quide/

- Read everyday for 10 minutes. We will be giving out three reading books; an Oxford book, a decodable RWI book and a read for pleasure book. We expect all children to have read everyday with a comment written in their record books.
- Fit Friday will be carrying on as usual on Friday, again children must come to school wearing Fit Friday t-shirts and trainers.
- P.E. day is on Monday. Please wear black bottoms and a white t-shirt.
- Bug Club and Mathletics is still mandatory for 5 or 10 minutes daily, on a Friday each class will announce their Bug Club and Mathletics champions. Please encourage your child to read as it builds their confidence and vocabulary.

Global Treasures

Our Topic for this half term is Global Treasures. Join us as we explore the exciting lessons planned:

English: We will be looking at cycle 2 which is linked to our Text Stone Age. Children will be exploring Factual Reports. They will begin by writing a Factual Report about the Stone Age. Later we will unpick the features of a Non-Chronological Report...

<u>Maths:</u> In Maths, we will focus on different ways of presenting data. We will explore pictograms, bar charts and tallies ..

<u>Science:</u> In Science we will be learning about fossils. We will spend some time identifying fossils and comparing different types.

<u>History:</u> This week we will be investigating the reasons why the Stone Age ended. Comparing it to the Iron Age and Bronze Age.

<u>RE:</u> In our RE we will be taking a closer look at the 5 K's in Sikhism and their meanings.

<u>DT</u>: In DT, we will be taking a closer look at coracle boats and their purpose.



Monday 6th May is a Bank holiday. School will be closed. Do continue to encourage your children to read daily and practice their Spellings and Times Tables. It is important to secure the foundations of their learning so that the next teacher can build on it.

Home learning

Please remember to read every day with your child particularly over half term, this should be kept record of in their Reading Record Books. Children will be sent home with books and will be asked to keep them in their book bags which they can now bring to school daily. Children will also be given weekly spellings beginning next week.

By the end of all Year 3 children need to know their 2,4,5,8 and 10 times tables fluently. So, please log in to Mathletics and TTRS to help you secure a Bronze Badge before the end of this academic year!

This week's Star moments 4L.....

This Week's Learning

We begin the first week with the three-week cycle of English lessons. The children will be learning more about the Romans and use this information to create fact files. As mathematicians, the children will begin a new topic the topic on mass. They will be converting units of length and mass. As scientists, we will continue learning about sound where the children will be investigating the pattern between volume and the strength of vibration of the sound source. As Historians we will look at why the Romans wanted to conquer Britain. All this new information will help us to understand why the Romans wanted to invade Britain in the first place. Our Spanish lessons continue to be enjoyed by everyone in Year 4, class teachers and TAs are learning the language alongside the children. Ask your child what Spanish they know, look at Languagenut together at home.

A very busy week is ahead for the children and alongside these lessons they will be reading, learning spellings and times tables.

In P.E. the children will continue with athletics and will be developing their skills in the art of running consistently and smoothly at different speeds. This will continue alongside music on a Tuesday morning where all children are expected in school in the correct P.E. kit.

Our new topic is...

In **Shared Reading**, we will start to read, discuss and unpick our new text, 'Viking Boy', about the son of a Viking chief who sets out to avenge his father's death after an attack by rival raiders.

In **English**, we will look at a range of non chronological reports and then write our own non chronological report about the Vikings.

In **Science,** we will be investigating how materials can be separated using sieving and filtering.

In **Computing**, we will be focusing on Online Safety where we will look at what is acceptable and unacceptable behaviour.

In **Maths**, we will be looking at equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages as well as comparing proportions using percentages.

In **History**, we will be exploring why the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings invaded Britain, where they came from and what they did.

In R.E. we will be finding out about Sikh beliefs about God.

In **D&T**: First, we will explore how to use the tools and equipment safely by creating a health and safety poster. Then we will work in groups to make our Anglo-Saxon and Viking catapults. Lastly, we will complete an evaluation of the finished product.

For our **Green Schools Project** we have been busy completing our action plans, deciding our job roles and getting our project ideas up and running!
