

We will be reading 'What can I do with Vegetable Glue' whilst continuing to develop and increase our confidence and fluency in reading and writing.



<u>Home learning</u>

Healthy Hearts

This half term 's theme is Healthy Hearts!!

In English: We will be exploring health, well-being and life-style choices through the texts Jim's Lion and Good Enough to eat. We start off the week with a Cold write on Explanation Texts based on healthy eating habits

In Maths we will be continuing our work on fractions. We will be comparing fractions. We start off by exploring equivalent fractions

In Science we will exploring our Topic Healthy Hearts by looking at diet and nutrition of animals including humans. We will look at the importance of balanced meals and exercise to keep healthy.

In Geography we will be learning about mapping and orienteering. This includes using coordinates and compasses. We will begin by exploring what a map is and looking at the symbols used for human and man-made features .We will be focusing on our local area.

In DT we will be designing, making and evaluating a healthy snack to find out about the principles of healthy eating and nutritional value of having a varied diet. We will look at the different food groups and name foods linked to each.

In R.E. we will be exploring the question: How did Buddha and Jesus make people stop and think? We will be looking at the stories they told and the teaching behind it

Don't forget!

Children will be given weekly spellings to practise for 5 minutes each night. They will be tested on Fridays. We politely ask children to practice the strategies and extend themselves by using the words in a sentence so that they understand the meaning. There will also be a big focus on Reading. So, please do ensure that you read with your child daily and that you record their progress in the Reading record provided. Please continue to encourage your child to complete their tasks on our online learning platforms including Mathletics, Bug Club and Times Table Rockstars. P.E is on Wednesday - please wear your PE kit to school. Fit Friday is every Friday.


Home learning

This week the children will continue working on our topic of Healthy Hearts. This will run alongside our Multiplication Tables Check this week. We will continue testing this week. As a reminder, the MTC is an online test where the pupils are asked 25 questions on times tables 2 to 12. For every question, you have 6 seconds to answer and in between the questions there is a 3-second rest. The questions are generated randomly based on the rules of the MTC. The children have had lots of practise and are ready to complete this check. As writers, the children will begin creating explanation texts by composing and rehearsing sentences orally and creating draft copies of their work. As mathematicians, the children will be looking at identifying and comparing angles. As scientists, we will begin learning about animals including humans and this week we will learn all about the digestive system by naming and labelling the main parts. As theologians, children will thoughtfully outline similarities and differences between different places of worship in our neighbourhood. As geographers, we will be looking at the different regions in the United

P.E. and Fit Friday will continue to play a big part in our Healthy Hearts topic this term. If you know we will be set for some very warm weather please apply sunscreen to children in the morning.

To add to this busy week the children will take part in a music workshop. We have a fantastic facilitator who will introduce the children to Gamelan. This is the traditional ensemble music of the Javanese, Sundanese, and Balinese peoples of Indonesia, made up predominantly of percussive instruments. The most common instruments used are metallophones and a set of hand-drums called kendang, which keep the beat. It has always been great fun!
