Black History Month

Star Primary School

October sees the start of <u>Black History Month</u>. Black History Month (BHM) is a great opportunity to explore Black history, heritage, culture and achievements, and spark discussion about equality and inclusion.

The theme this year is 'Reclaiming narratives' - an invitation to every member of the Black community to take part in how their stories are told and ensuring their voices are heard, experiences acknowledged and contributions celebrated.

We have some very exciting learning going on across the school during BHM:

Nursery and Reception are exploring identity, family and community and developing an understanding of fairness and how it feels to be treated differently.

Years 1 to 6 are exploring different periods of black history through Big Questions:

Year 1: How have extraordinary people contributed to Black History?

Year 2: How has equality in sport developed throughout history? - with a focus on Jesse Owens against the backdrop of Nazi Germany.

Year 3: How have women contributed to Equality around the world? - with a focus on Rosa Parks and Harriet Tubman.

Year 4: Was the American Civil Rights Movement successful?

Year 5: What is the legacy of the Windrush Generation?

Year 6: What was Britain's role in the transatlantic slave trade and how has it contributed to the Britain we know today?

In addition, we have a very exciting opportunity for the children to learn about various Afro-Caribbean dance styles through an immersive and interactive assembly presented by a local, black-owned performing arts school! Through the experience, the children will gain a deeper appreciation of black cultures and participate in various Afro-Caribbean dance styles, including Soca, Dancehall, Afrobeat, and Kaiso!


